CERT CONTAINER & TRAINING

CERT training covers basic skills that are important to know in a disaster when emergency services are not available. With training and practice, and by working as a team, CERT training prepares us to be able to protect and help the greatest number of people after a disaster. Before, during, and after disasters, CERT volunteer teams perform basic response activities, including checking in on neighbors, distributing information to the public, supporting emergency operations centers, and helping to manage traffic and crowds.

However, if there are no supplies to help in emergencies it would make it difficult to be an effective CERT volunteer. Thanks to generous donations by LA County Supervisor, Kathryn Barger, and the LA Country Fire Department the ADWC CERT container continues to grow with supplies to help in an emergency. Here are volunteers, **Anne Marenco, Tracy Dulle, Brian Dulle and Angela Phillips** putting together shelves, unloading supplies and organizing them in the new CERT container. 


