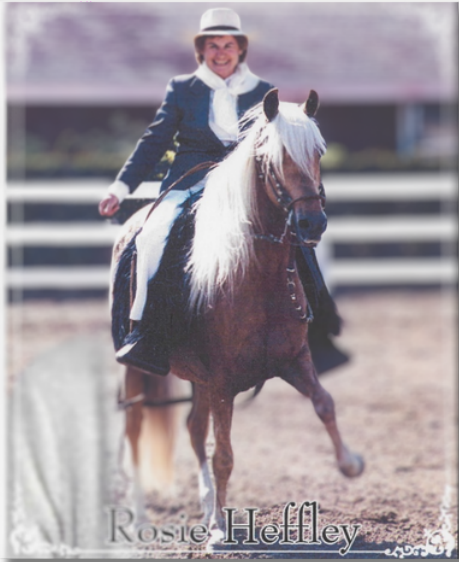

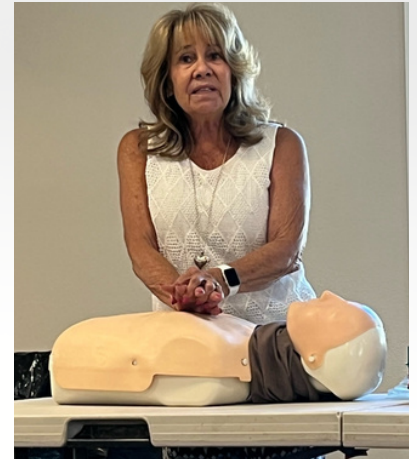

Labor Day - Observed the first Monday in September, Labor Day is an annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of American workers. The holiday is rooted in the late nineteenth century, when labor activists pushed for a federal holiday to recognize the many contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and well-being.

The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City, in accordance with the plans of the Central Labor Union. The Central Labor Union held its second Labor Day holiday just a year later, on September 5, 1883. By 1894, 23 more states had adopted the holiday, and on June 28, 1894, President Grover Cleveland signed a law making the first Monday in September of each year a national holiday.

American labor has raised the nation's standard of living and contributed to the greatest production the world has ever known and the labor movement has brought us closer to the realization of our traditional ideals of economic and political democracy. It is appropriate, therefore, that the nation pays tribute on Labor Day to the creator of so much of the nation's strength, freedom, and leadership – **the American worker.**

SOUR CREAM POTATOES

6 medium white potatoes
1/3 cup chopped green onions
1/2 cup melted butter
1 pint sour cream
1 pound grated cheddar cheese
salt and pepper

Boil potatoes for 20 minutes. Cool, peel, and grate the potatoes. Mix remaining ingredients together with potatoes. Can be made night before and refrigerated. Take out of refrigerator for 30 minutes before baking. Bake covered at 350 degrees F for 35-40 minutes.
